Impulse für die Arbeit mit (non-binären) Patient_innen

- Informieren Sie sich über non-binäre Identitäten.
- Respektieren Sie die geschlechtliche Selbstbeschreibungen Ihrer Patient_innen.
- Respektieren und verwenden Sie die gewünschte Anrede und Pronomen.
- Schulen Sie Ihre Angestellten, das auch zu tun.
- Stellen Sie (relevante) Nachfragen.
- Verzichten Sie auf irrelevante Nachfragen.
- Transparenz: Erklären Sie, warum sie eine bestimmte Information brauchen.
- Best Practice: gewünschte Namen, Anrede und Pronomen im Aufnahmebogen

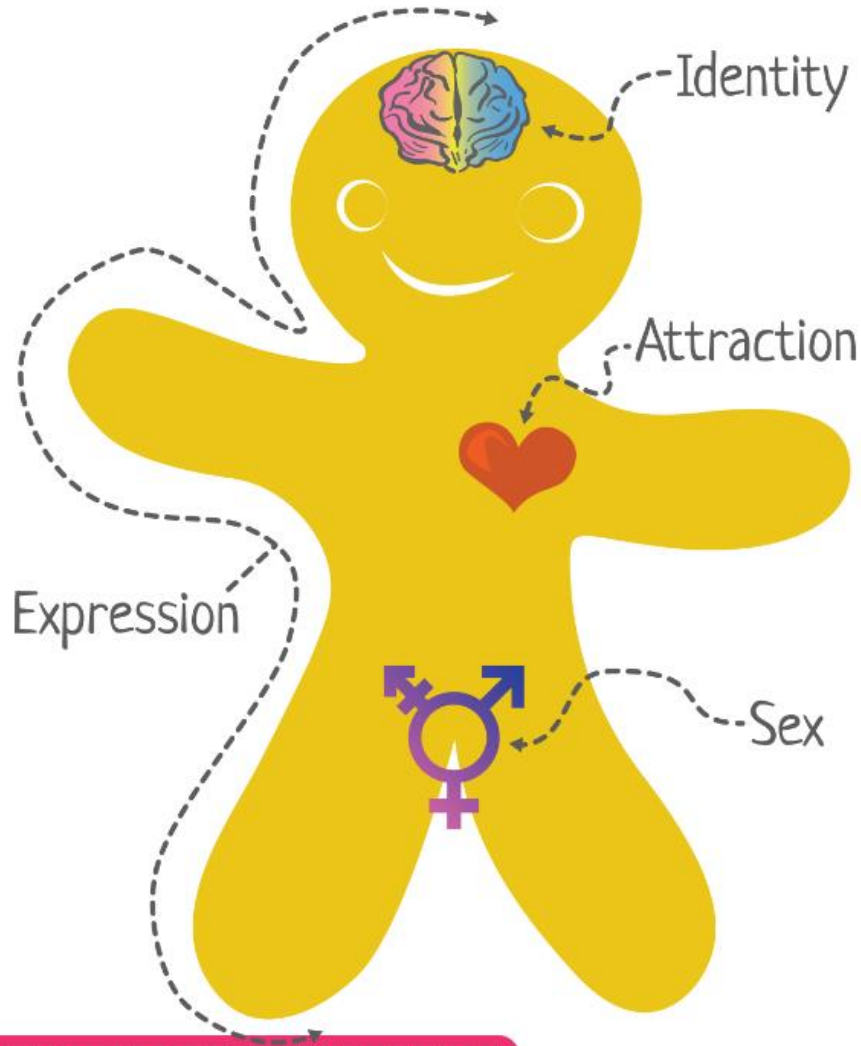
